

COVID-19 Just a Reminder


Wash your hands frequently.

Introducing Lov'ly Nyjah Bell

Hi! My name is Lov'ly Nyjah Bell, I am a 15-month-old who loves to suck my thumb and play with my learning bear. Can you believe I was a Micro Preemie! I was born at 22 weeks on January 27, 2019 weighing a "whooping" 15 ounces. Of course, doctors tried to convince my parents that having me would be fatal for my mother and myself, but I'm so glad that their faith prevailed despite the doctor's orders.



During my "Micro Life" I have overcome several major obstacles. I spent 423 days in the NICU at 3 different hospitals. In those 423 days 40% of my body was burned due to an allergic reaction. I beat the flu twice and I endured 4 surgeries. On October 20, 2019 my team of doctors struggled mightily to keep me breathing, but needless to say God kept me while they spent 30 plus minutes trying to get a breathing tube down my throat. I'm not totally out of the red because I'm still battling Chronic Lung Disease and Pulmonary Hypertension. Me and my mom are "twinsies" because we both are on oxygen and I also wear leads that tracks my oxygen levels and heart rate. I'm fascinated with my feeding tube so much that I try pulling it out several times a day!! It drives my dad up a wall, ha ha!!!

I will admit that being in the NICU for so long has caused me some separation anxiety. I freak out when I'm in unfamiliar places or if my parents aren't in plain sight. I'm adjusting to home life and the oh so wonderful sounds of my two older brothers who are also a part of the Preemie Gang! I love being the youngest because I get all the attention and I enjoy watching them fight and argue over me! Just a heads up, my oldest brother is overly protective of me and honestly thinks he is my dad.

I want to give a big shout out to my parents, especially my mom for sacrificing her life in order to give me life!! Mother's Day is upon us and she deserves something really special!!! I would like to give a great big shout out to The Residence Inn Hotel in Overland Park (room #134), who housed my family for 8 months. This is where my father perfected his skills in "catch a girl get a girl". He caught my mom in August and got me in January. Thanks Dad!!!

Due to the pandemic we are currently facing, I have not been out the house to see the faces of my church family, **but I did take a few snap shots so you can get a glimpse of what LOVE looks like.** I'm so grateful for the prayers of righteous men and women who interceded on my behalf to an Able God. Please do not stop praying for me and my family. Please continue to pray for every NICU baby and their families around the world because during my stay I lost 3 roommates.

I really want to thank the newsletter team for allowing me to share a bit of my testimony. I encourage all of you that no matter what it looks like or sounds like, share your testimony with others so they can see that God is still working extraordinary miracles through ordinary people like you and I. **Got to go, my fingers hurt from all this typing!!!**



What is a stroke?

A stroke occurs when a blood vessel in the brain ruptures and bleeds, or when there's a blockage in the blood supply to the brain. The rupture or blockage prevents blood and oxygen from reaching the brain's tissues.



According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), stroke is the fifth-leading cause of death in the United States. Every year, more than 795,000 U.S. people have a stroke. Without oxygen, brain cells and tissue become damaged and begin to die within minutes.

Stroke symptoms

The loss of blood flow to the brain damages tissues within the brain. Symptoms of a stroke show up in the body parts controlled by the damaged areas of the brain. The sooner a person having a stroke gets care, the better their outcome is likely to be. For this reason, it's helpful to know the signs of a stroke so you can act quickly. Stroke symptoms can include:

Paralysis, numbness or weakness in the arm, face, and leg, especially on one side of the body, trouble speaking or understanding speech, confusion, slurring speech, vision problems, such as trouble seeing in one or both eyes with vision blackened or blurred, or double vision, trouble walking, loss of balance or coordination, dizziness severe, sudden headache with an unknown cause

A stroke requires immediate medical attention. If you think you or someone else is having a stroke, have someone call 911 right away. Prompt treatment is key to preventing the following outcomes:

- brain damage
- long-term disability
- death

It's better to be safe than sorry when dealing with a stroke, so don't be afraid to call 911 if you think you recognize the signs of a stroke. *Act FAST and learn to recognize the signs of stroke.*

Types of stroke

Strokes fall into three main categories: transient ischemic attack (TIA), ischemic stroke, and hemorrhagic stroke. These categories are further broken down into other types of strokes, including:

embolic stroke, thrombotic stroke, intracerebral stroke, subarachnoid stroke
